




Annual Report

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
The Pandemic Can't Cancel Love

When face-to-face ministry was paused in March 2020 because of COVID-19, our ministry leaders across the country continued reaching out and keeping up with kids in the communities where YFC serves. Read this story about how God not only maintained relationships between YFC leaders and kids in this season, but also orchestrated them.

At our last club before Oregon went into "shelter in place," we had an issue with one of our regular students. She is one of those kids that just drives you nuts. I think everyone who has done ministry with teenagers knows exactly what I am talking about. Her level of disruption this week was at a whole new level. She was checked out of anything that had to do with school and was lashing out at our Campus Life team. The last time we saw her she yelled at us, "You all suck, and I am never coming back here." It felt like a hopeless situation. Who knew God could use a pandemic to later restore this relationship.

After a few weeks of regularly posting encouragement on our social media, we got a message from this student. "I hate quarantine. I hate this. I hate all of it."

After very clearly telling our team she wanted nothing to do with us, this student reached out in a small way. After chatting a bit, she shared that her home life was hard, and school was the one place she could get away. She was already struggling with her classes and was terrified that she would fail them when moving to online distance learning. We met her with encouragement and hope while offering tutoring help. Her response? "Thank you for always supporting and understanding. You always are nice to me even when I am not." You see, many things were canceled in this season, but love isn't. The Gospel isn't. This student is now regularly attending virtual club and engaging with local youth pastors and believers who are sharing the light of Christ with her - a breakthrough that probably wouldn't have happened otherwise. In this time of uncertainty, the good news of our Savior is still just as good. Sometimes it takes a little bit of darkness to truly appreciate the light.

What It Takes

Through extensive research conducted by the Arbor Research Group,* we have found the following to be true:



- There is a direct correlation between the number of ministry leaders per site and the number of kids in authentic, Christ-sharing relationships.
- By increasing the number of ministry leaders per site, we can increase the number of kids we reach.
- Our healthiest ministry sites are those who have paid staff who are mobilizing a large number of volunteers.
- Exemplary evangelistic youth ministry happens when YFC staff partner closely with local churches.
- The main goal of ministry must be for staff, volunteers, and young leaders to be passionately pursuing kids in one-on-one relationships.
- It will take approximately 200,000 ministry leaders to reach one million kids.
- At least 100,000 of these need to be 11-19 year old young leaders who are equipped to share Christ with their lost friends.

The need is clear.

In order to reach one million kids, we need more staff who are passionate about reaching lost 11-19 year olds. More volunteer ministry leaders who can prioritize one-on-one relationships with lost kids. Overall, more ministry leaders who can train and equip saved 11-19 year olds to reach their lost friends.

The need is great.

But what these numbers show is that the goal is within reach. Our dream to reach one million kids is possible.

By investing in the ministry of Youth For Christ, you help equip more staff, more volunteer ministry leaders, and more young leaders for the mission of reaching one million lost 11-19 year olds around the nation.

^{*} Arbor Research Group began the research project on January 19, 2019 and concluded its research on April 28, 2019. 135 ministry sites were contacted in addition to an equal amount from a control group from 338 other ministry sites. The Arbor team completed 56 virtual interviews with YFC staff members from across the country.


