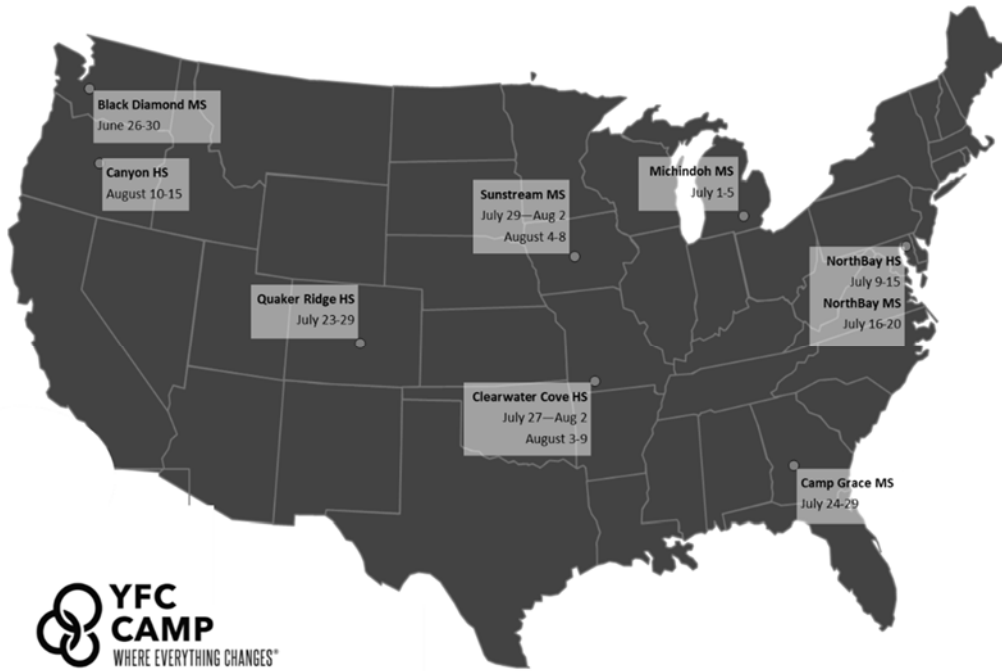


2017 YFC CAMP SUMMARY REPORT

MINISTRY MODELS REPRESENTED ::

Of all Cabin Leaders and Campers ::

- 80% represent a CAMPUS LIFE ministry model
- 15% represent a CITY LIFE ministry model
- 5% represent other national ministry models

16% (248 of 1502) of camp eligible* ministry sites represented

HOW DOES YFC CAMP INFLUENCE MINISTRY LEADER INVOLVEMENT AT THE LOCAL LEVEL?

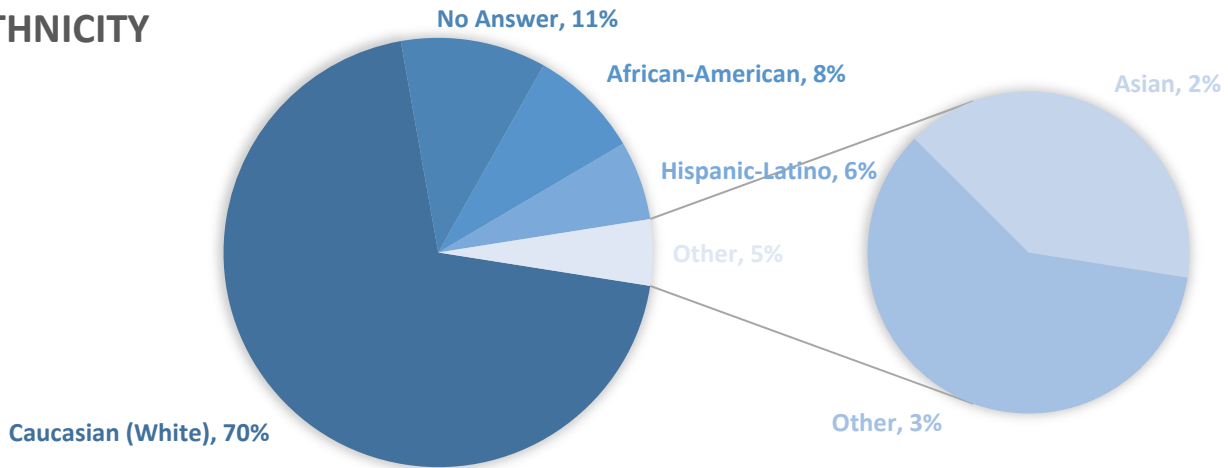
32% of leaders at camp in 2017 state that they are involved in local YFC ministries because they were once a kid in that ministry program and/or a past camper making them an indigenous leader.

30% of leaders at camp in 2017 state that they became more involved in local YFC ministries as a direct result of the experience they had at YFC Camp in years prior.

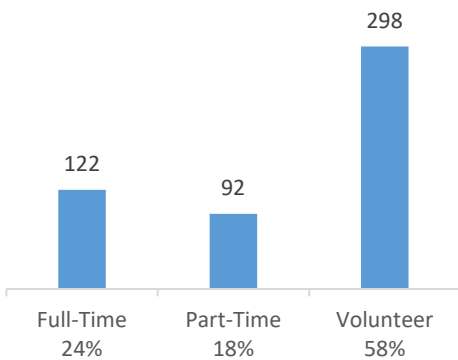

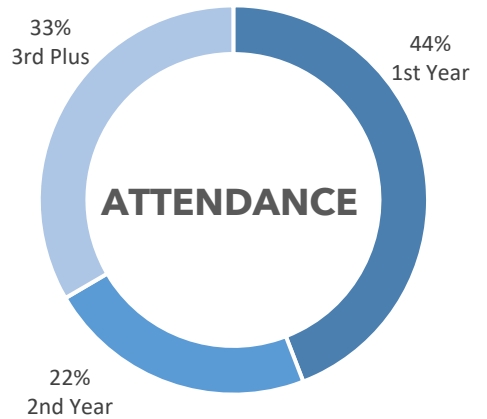

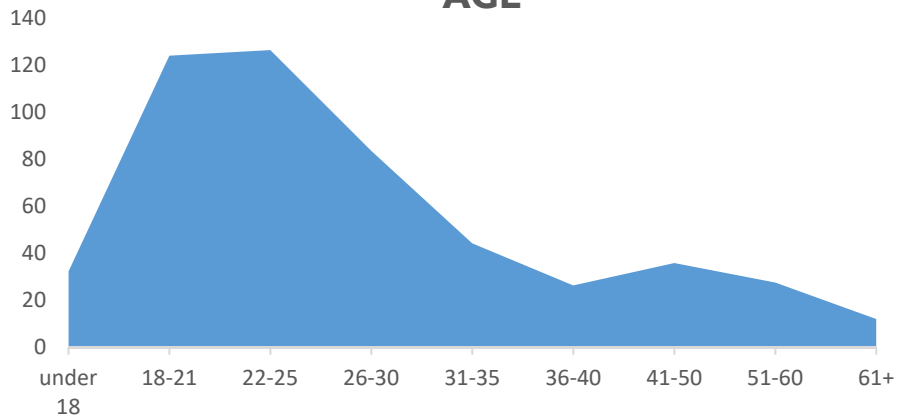

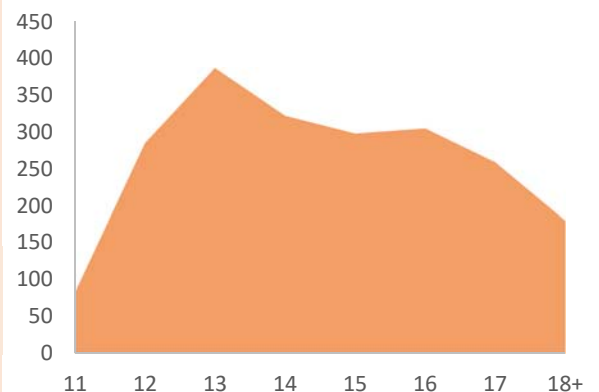

85% of all campers made a decision to deepen or begin their relationship with Jesus.

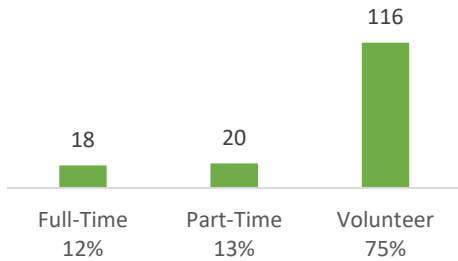
10% of campers intentionally brought a non-christian friend to camp with them.

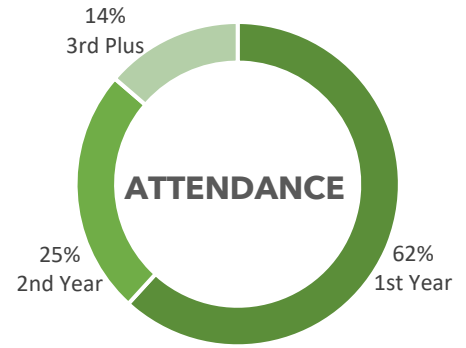

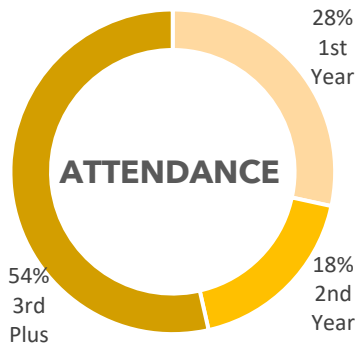
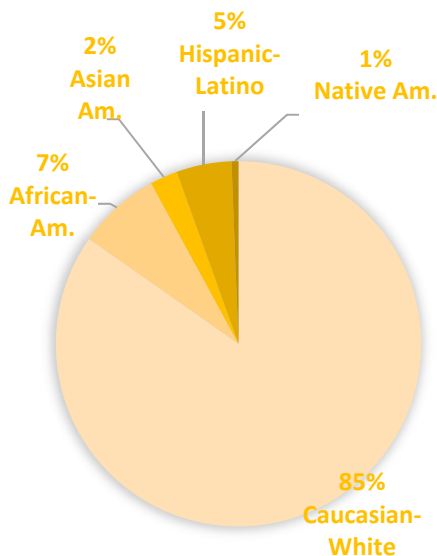
FUN FACTS ::

- 3028 total people served (Campers, Cabin Leaders, Lead Support Teams)
- 149 meals were served which translates into 37,923 table settings!
- Cumulative PS volunteer hours over 11 camps = 31,920. That translates into \$331,968 (based on NY state minimum wage)

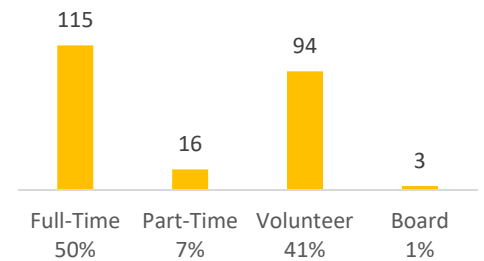

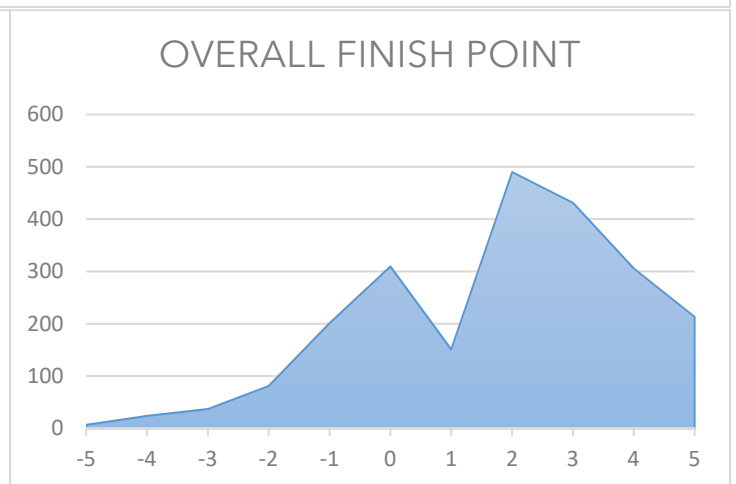
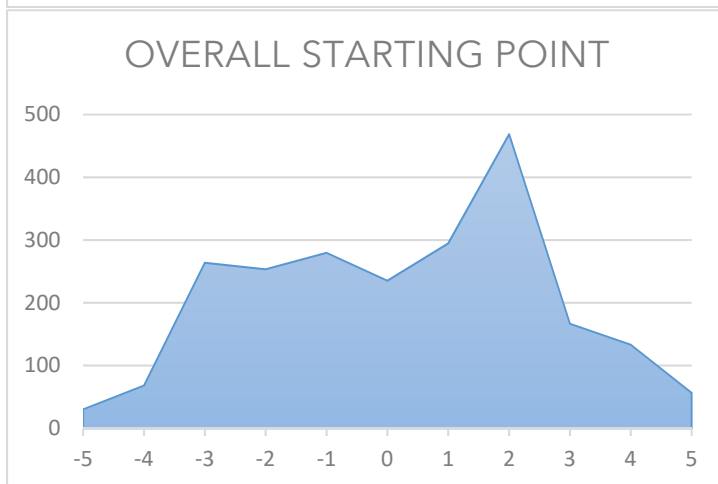
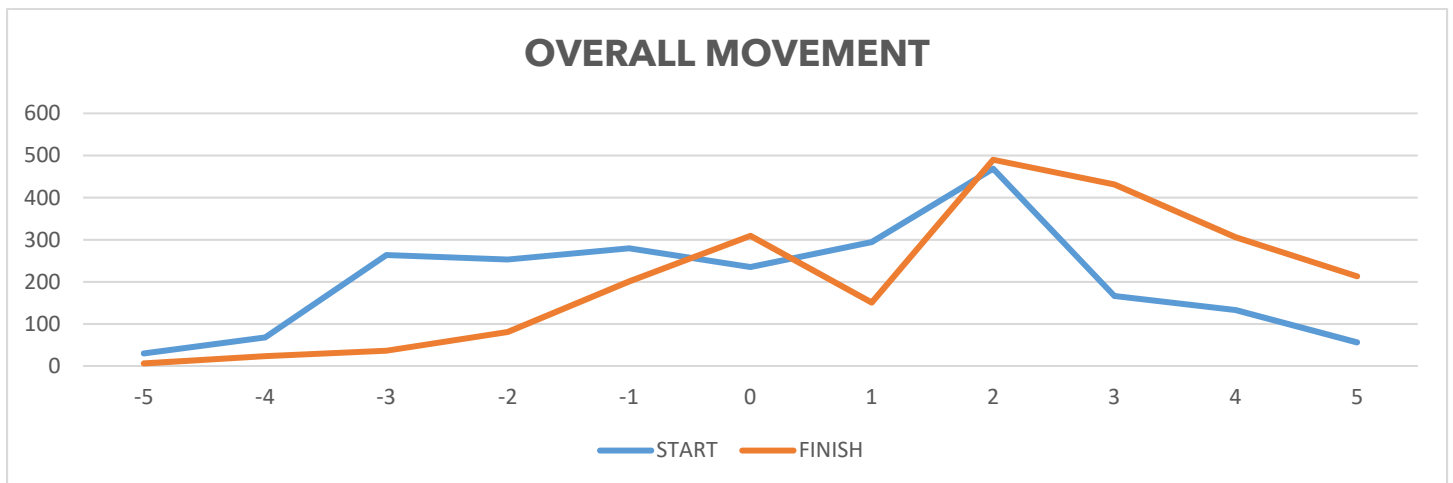


MOVEMENT SPECTRUM

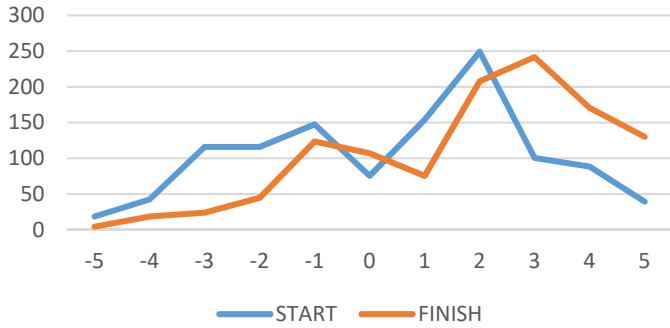
PURPOSE: YFC Camp wanted a way to capture a kid’s movement toward Jesus during a week of camp. We have always collected the standard three responses of “Yes,” “Yes again,” and “Not Yet.” However, our goal is not **just** to help move kids to a place of saying Yes to Christ for the first time in their lives. We also desire to see everyone experience Jesus and move closer to Him no matter where they are at on their faith journey.



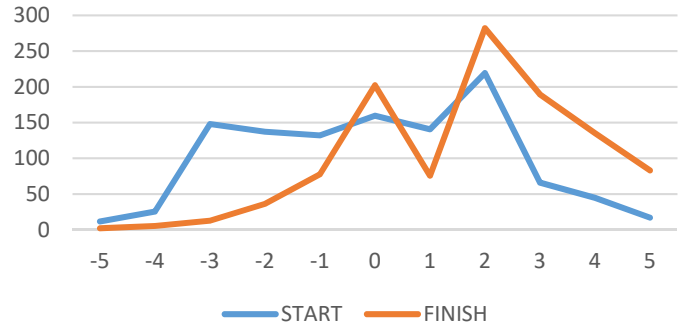
In an end-of-week survey, campers rated where they believed themselves to be on the spectrum before they arrived to camp and where they believed themselves to be after being at camp for the week. Each dot on the spectrum was assigned a numerical value for the purposes of data analysis starting with -5 on the far left and +5 on the far right. Zero represents the middle of the spectrum where a kid says ‘Yes’ to Jesus for the first time.



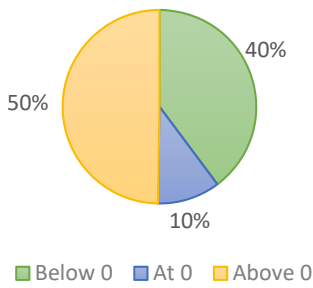
HIGH SCHOOL MOVEMENT



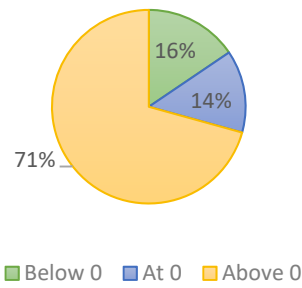
MIDDLE SCHOOL MOVEMENT



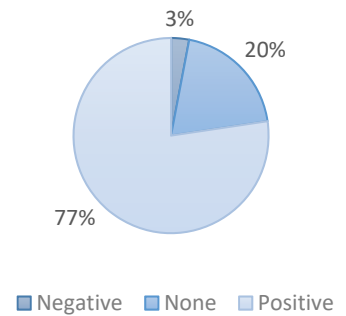
START %
